Dean Sutherland's journey is a testament to the transformative power of opportunity and unwavering support. From wiring circuits as an electrician to preparing for a main event bout at Madison Square Garden, his story is one of dreams realised, thanks in large part to the TEXO Foundation.

"Honestly, the simplest way I could put it with TEXO Foundation, what it's done for me, it has changed my life," Sutherland states, his voice filled with genuine gratitude. "It's revolutionised my life, it's given me the opportunity to fulfil a childhood dream of becoming a full-time athlete."

For Sutherland, boxing wasn't just a passion; it was a burning ambition. But balancing the demanding training schedule with the rigors

of a full-time job was a near-impossible feat. That's where the TEXO Foundation stepped in, providing the financial security and unwavering belief that allowed him to dedicate himself entirely to his sport.

"It's allowed me to now become a full-time athlete, I'm now training with the best team possible in Scotland, and my next opportunity is going to be the main event, which is still unbelievable, at Madison Square Garden in New York on St Paddy's Day weekend," he recounts, the excitement palpable.

This upcoming fight, for the WBC Continental America's Title, against Callum Walsh, a highly touted undefeated fighter, will be broadcast worldwide on UFC Fight Pass, reaching millions. It's a surreal moment for Sutherland, a dream he admits hasn't fully sunk in.

He credits Chris Smith, the Managing Director of TEXO, for his unwavering belief and support, not just in his boxing career but also through personal challenges. "Not only did he change my life in terms of my career, but the opportunity that's been able to come through, the tough times outside the ring, TEXO Foundation still continued their support, gave me very much needed help during that period of time, to keep me on track."

Sutherland emphasises that TEXO is more than just a company; it's a team, a community. "Realistically TEXO I consider not as a company, I consider everybody at TEXO as a part of my personal team, when it comes down to it."

He highlights the Foundation's impact beyond his own career, praising their commitment to the wider community. "The massive impact that TEXO Foundation has got to not just teams but individuals... It just goes to show that TEXO isn't just a company, it is really a part of the community and it's actually, probably, the heartbeat of the community."

Sutherland candidly discusses the financial realities of professional boxing, where the path to success is often fraught with hardship. He acknowledges his fortunate position, recognising the countless others who dream of similar opportunities. As he prepares to step into the iconic Madison Square Garden ring, he carries with him the unwavering support of TEXO, a testament to the power of belief and the transformative impact of giving back.




